- d) giving lectures to students in Nitra University and/or hosting the lecturers from Nitra in VUDPaP seminars in order to present their scientific work
- e) facilitate with Diploma Thesisess of students (on the part of VUDPaP experts)

Hristo has been always open to the new ideas. In some moment I sent him an e-mail inviting him to meeting of Section for Education, Slovak Commission for UNESCO, where we would discuss the potential development of the Centre for Advancement of Roma Childlren Education, serving for the Central and East Euroepan countries. The response came very soon, simple and positive: "Dear Dagmar, thank you for the information and I will try to help in every possible way". Well, this is typical Hristo. Never refused an invitation, never said "I can not" and never let people down. He has been always searching for the solutions.

I always admired his great enthusiasm, diligence and ardour for a good matter. But most of all I admire his friendliness, frankness and humanity. He is a wonderful model for other Roma people to follow and reach their goals.

On behalf of his round anniversary, let me wish to Hristo firm health, much joy, success and a huge personal satisfaction from his research, publication and scientific work.
